

Parron Maam Marang Farm

Community Update – edition 1

Project overview

Atmos Renewables is working with its local development partner to deliver the Parron Maam Marang Farm, a 78-turbine, 470-megawatt (MW) renewable energy project in Western Australia's wheatbelt, around 200km north of Perth.

The Project will be constructed, owned and operated by Atmos Renewables and is expected to be operational by Q4, 2028.

The wind farm is located on approximately 8,400 hectares of privately owned land and will co-exist with existing farming activities. The name Maam Marang, meaning "strong wind", was chosen in recognition of the project's connection to Country and the project's partnership with Yued People, the Traditional custodians of the land.

The Coordinator General has given PMMF a Priority Project Designation, which will mean that the project will receive elevated coordination and project facilitation services, as well as a high level of oversight from the WA government, signalling the importance to the state.

Working together with Yued Aboriginal Corporation

Atmos Renewables and Yued Aboriginal Corporation have signed a Relationship Agreement for the proposed Parron Maam Marang Farm near Badgingarra, on Yued Boodja. The agreement sets out how we will work together as the project progresses.

It includes support for local jobs and contracting, funding for cultural and community initiatives, and ongoing involvement of Yued rangers in caring for Country. A joint committee will also be established to keep communication open and transparent.

Over the life of the Project, the agreement is expected to deliver more than \$4 million in direct benefits, along with broader opportunities for First Peoples' businesses and employment.

What next

The Parron Maam Marang Farm recently reached two important milestones, with the project securing both a Capacity Investment Scheme Agreement (CISA) and a long-term Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with Synergy, the Western Australian Government owned retailer.

These agreements provide the long-term revenue certainty needed to progress the project toward construction and form part of a broader program to deliver new renewable energy capacity across Western Australia.

From mid-2026, a range of early works are expected to begin to support the project schedule. These include site investigations, works at the Yerramullah Terminal Station, and upgrades to Cowalla Road and the Brand Highway intersection.

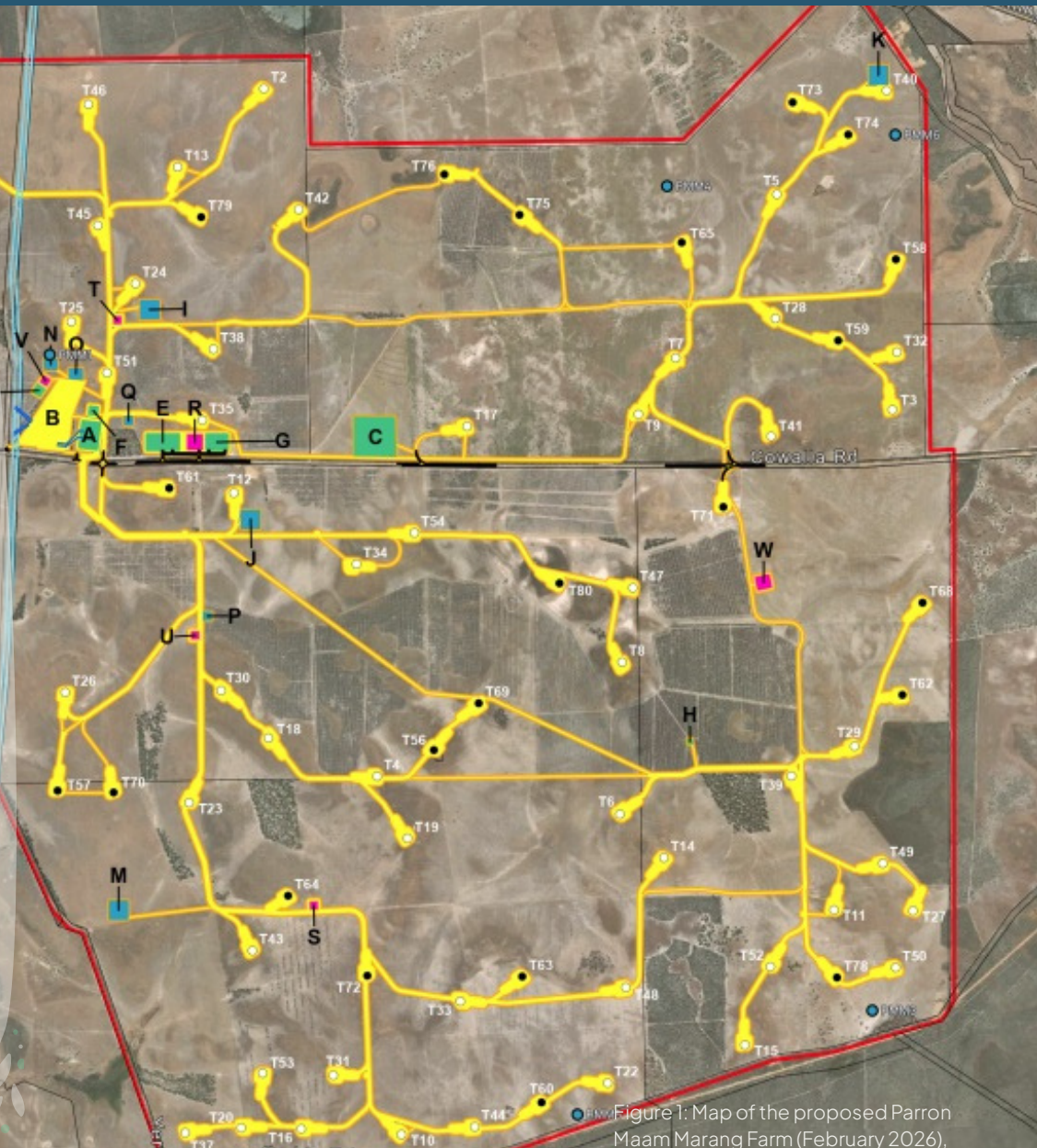
During this time, you may notice increased heavy vehicle and machinery movements, as well as some changes to traffic conditions, particularly along Cowalla Road. These works will help prepare the road for construction traffic, including strengthening and resurfacing to support safe vehicle movements.

Subject to final timing, major construction is currently anticipated to begin in the second half of 2026. We will continue to keep the community informed as works progress.

Turbine layout

The turbine layout and overall project design has been informed by extensive technical studies and ongoing engagement with landowners, the local community and Yued Aboriginal Corporation.

Design has been undertaken in close collaboration with landowners to minimise impacts to existing farming practices and has been refined through engagement with Yued to reflect cultural considerations and connection to Country
